Pastor's Page

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During this last week of June I got "hung up" on the word "accessibility." My "hang up" has grown out of recent conversations regarding weekly communion and continuous communion.

Conversations about the physical challenges that some in this congregation face and that my father faced after contracting polio, have influenced or contributed to my "hang up." When I use the word "accessibility" in this article I mean both spiritual and physical accessibility. I suppose the more current term relating to accessibility is "barrier free."

Paul wrote in his letter to the Romans, "Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained **access** to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God." (5:1-2) Eugene Peterson in his paraphrase, *The Message* talks about God throwing open the door to us through and because of Jesus. Indeed God does throw open the door to grace and puts out a welcome mat that does not exclude anyone. All that is required is faith and of course that also comes as a gift from God.

As your spiritual leader, I see offering weekly communion as a way of making God's grace even more accessible or readily available for people. Martin Luther suggested that as we wake each morning we recall our baptism, the death we died to sin, and the new life we have being clothed in Christ. In baptism we are washed clean, forgiven and born again. Offering communion each Sunday or every Lord's Day nourishes us with yet another reminder of God's boundless forgiveness and grace; and of Christ's constant presence with us as we partake of the wine and bread, Christ's body and blood. We can leave worship strengthened to serve as well as face confidently all that the week will bring.

The following principle is lifted up in a publication of the ELCA called *Use of the Means of Grace, a Statement on the Practice of Word and Sacrament*: "According to the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, Lutheran congregations celebrate the Holy Communion every Sunday and festival. This confession remains the norm for our practice." (p. 39) We celebrate communion frequently because we the Church need it. Holy Communion is the "means by which the Church's fellowship is established and its mission as the baptized people of

God is nourished and sustained." (p. 39) God invites us to the table and we are encouraged to make this sacrament a frequent part of our lives.

Continuous Communion is another way we can make God's grace more accessible. You already practice a variation of it since you do not commune by "tables." The final blessing is given after all have communed. Some have difficulty negotiating the steps that lead to the altar rail yet are still wanting to come forward. Others cannot come forward at all so we bring communion to them. Albert Le Blanc now has some challenges because of medical problems with his foot. He has enrolled in seminary and wants to continue helping with worship leadership. Serving continuous communion from the main floor will make it easier for Albert to assist and serve communion as well as for others to receive communion. Minimally we will have to adapt for the time being.

Even without making these changes and adaptations you will read elsewhere that help is needed in order for the St. Anne's Guild to continue making it possible for us to have communion at all. It is a labor of love for which we are very thankful. Will you help make this Sacrament through which we receive God's grace more accessible? Is this a way to put Christ's peace to work in the world or at least in our worship?

I leave you with a related question: How do we make our whole facility more welcoming, user-friendly and barrier-free or accessible?

Through Christ we are freed from sin and death. Through Christ we are freed to serve. In this country we have the freedom to express what we believe. Have a glorious 4th of July!

Notes from the Side...

Peace to you all and Happy Summer! I have several things that I'd like to cover in this month's newsletter so I'll just go ahead and get stated.

We are in need of some volunteers for the St. Anne's Altar Guild. This is one of the many ministries we have here a Peace. This team is responsible for all matters regarding the Altar (i.e. linens, flowers, paraments, communion set-up, etc.). Please prayerfully consider helping out in this ministry. If you are interested in participating, please contact Pr. Hormann or Lucille Hrivnak. All are welcome: women *and* men!

I would like to update everyone regarding my recent health issue. I have been diagnosed with Charcot's Disease (pronounced "Shar-koh"). In those with Charcot's disease the ability to sense pain is usually lost or impaired (as a result of diabetic neuropathy). The muscles lose their ability to support the foot correctly. As a result of this, minor trauma (i.e. sprains or stress fractures) to the foot go undetected and do not get treated. This leads to a slackness of the ligaments, joints being dislocated, bone and cartilage being damaged and deformity to the foot. My doctor has ordered me to stay off my foot for at least two months. During this time, our hope (and prayer) is that the foot will heal sufficiently so that I can resume walking on it with some specialized footwear. I appreciate the prayers that you all have been lifting up for my family and me during this time. It really has made a huge impact in our lives. Pr. Hormann has agreed to work with me on developing creative ways that I can still assist in my ministry at Peace. I appreciate your understanding and flexibility during this time.

Okay...let's end with some good news! The initial process and paperwork is done. I am officially a Seminarian! My graduate level term paper was reviewed and accepted by the board, which was the final step in the admission process. I have received my initial orientation and have completed the one on one interview with my Dean. I have registered for my classes and have already started online discussion with other incoming Seminararians. As customary for Seminararians in many denominations (including the Lutheran church), I will now be wearing a clerical collar on Sundays and whenever I am acting on church business (i.e. visitations, funerals, etc.). The collar is worn as a sign of my commitment and dedication to my call to the ministry of Word and Sacrament. I am looking forward to beginning this phase of my call and am excited to be able to exercise my call within our congregation. Pr. Hormann and the Board of Elders continue to be

supportive of me as I try to learn and grow in my ministry. Pastor and I will be working closely on various aspects of worship planning and may even branch out in other areas within the church so that I can gain more experience in executing the office of a Pastor.

As always, I stand in humble service to our Lord and to you, my brothers and sisters. May God's peace be with you as you enjoy these summer months.

Meeting Minutes -- Board of Finance

We met on 6/14 at 6:30 p.m. We opened with prayer. Don Pushman gave us a run-down of the current financial picture, which was good overall. Contributions remain about the same as last year. We have \$54,508.39 in the bank. We have a roof loan balance of \$13,800. Bills for the month total \$2,374.22.

We discussed the need to replace a boiler room door, which will cost \$1,600. The Trustees are getting quotes for stripping the wax off the floors, too. Don Silsbe expressed a concern that more ex-members of Peace have keys to the church than active members. This is a big security risk. We discussed changing the locks, and reissuing keys only to officers and staff. The Trustees will investigate the cost of doing this. Meeting adjourned at 7:30.

From Don's Desk

Times have changed. When I was a kid, my family used to watch shows like “Leave it to Beaver”, “My Three Sons”, and “Sing Along with Mitch”. Today we have shows like “American Idol”, “Sex in the City”, and “Wife Swap”.

When I was a kid, you picked a pastor first by checking with friends to see who was available, and then checking with Synod to see who *they* thought was available. You formed a call committee, interviewed them, and chose. You pretty much got who was available at the moment, after you did a little weeding out. Sometimes this worked, and sometimes it didn't. But times have changed.

Now, both pastors and congregations fill out a mission profile, when they are shopping around. These documents are kept on file by the Synod, so interested parties can get a detailed look at a prospective pastor or congregation. This process is intended to improve the success of matching pastors with congregations—fewer surprises that way, I guess.

Well, I want you to know that I just downloaded a blank congregational profile form from the ELCA website. It is 13 pages long! It will be the objective of our Call Committee, **with lots of help from all of us**, to fill out this form completely. I will print it out and put it on the bulletin board in the long hallway for everyone to see. Let me show you **just a few** of the questions that are on this form. (There are a lot more that I didn't list.)

- ❖ Congregation Name—OK, that was an easy one. They get harder.
- ❖ List your three previous pastors, length of time they served, and their reasons for leaving.
- ❖ Describe the service ministries of the congregation, its community involvement and ecumenical partnerships.
- ❖ Briefly describe the congregation's stewardship practices. What process is used for determining the annual income projections?
- ❖ Describe the larger community in which the church building is located and list the sources of your information.
- ❖ What trends in the community should be addressed by the congregation in the next five years?
- ❖ What is your congregation excited about?

The next section is my favorite. It lists 30 “perceived necessary skills” for our future pastor. We get to rate the priority and skill level for each of these. For example, in the ministry area of “Preaching”, how important are the preaching skills of our future pastor, on a scale of 1 to 5? Other ministry areas include Teaching, Social Ministry, Financial Management, Planner, Musical and Artistic, etc. There are thirty of these. We all know that you can't put down “5's” for all 30 categories, right? *Right?*

I'm looking at these pages, and thinking that we have a lot of work ahead of us. It is going to take all of us working together, to fill these forms out accurately. If we do a sloppy job, we suffer the consequences.

And what if we skip it? In the past six months, I have heard of the availability of three pastors. Three pastors for Peace! Each time, a little voice inside of me said “Grab him (or her)!” Then I thought about it. What sort of desperate pastor would you get, if they didn't care whether or not you filled out this profile? And what have they done in their past, that made them this desperate? So I say “no thank you”, and find myself recommitted to this long and difficult process.

So, take a moment, and look at the blank pages I've posted on the bulletin board. See how many questions you would find difficult to answer. Then, commit yourself to helping the Interim Task Force do our best to fill this out accurately. This is the best insurance we can buy for the security of Peace's future.
